

Suspected Respiratory Cancers

CXR suggestive of lung cancer or if CXR -ve but significant ongoing clinical concerns **refer for 2WW**

Aged >40 yrs

With unexplained haemoptysis

Who is a smoker / ex-smoker / has asbestos exposure with any unexplained:

With 2 of these symptoms & never smoked:

With

- Persistent / recurrent RTI
- Finger Clubbing
- Supraclavicular or persistent cervical lymphadenopathy
- Chest signs consistent with lung cancer / pleural disease
- Thrombocytosis

- Cough
- Fatigue
- Dyspnoea
- Chest pain
- Weight loss
- Appetite loss

Consider bloods for U/E, LFT , FBC, and BONE PROFILE at time of 2 week referral.

2WW Referral

* CXR mandatory before seen in clinic. A streamlined service for respiratory cancers is in place at HDFT so no need for CT to be requested prior to 2ww appointment.
